## **Nominate a Threatened Historic Property to the Preservation Alliance's 6th Annual Endangered Properties List**

(September 5, 2008) -- It's that time again. Each year, the Preservation Alliance asks individuals and community organizations throughout the region to nominate threatened historic properties to its annual Endangered Properties list. The Preservation Alliance is particularly interested in properties that might not be well known and have special historic significance to Philadelphia neighborhoods.

Nominations are due October 1.

Past nominated historic properties have included houses, churches, schools, libraries, apartment buildings, stores, movie theaters, cemeteries and historic objects; statues, bridges and water towers. "After enduring for decades, or centuries, these historic places may disappear for lack of care, cash or commitment," said John Andrew Gallery, the Alliance's executive director. "In addition to identifying and drawing public attention to the most endangered properties in our region, we also suggest steps that could help save them."

Past Endangered Properties lists have included the Boyd Theater, (now listed on the Philadelphia Register of Historic Places), ornate facades along Chestnut Street and the Fort Washington Hotel, now restored with offices and a restaurant.
